

STATISTICAL BULLETIN: CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

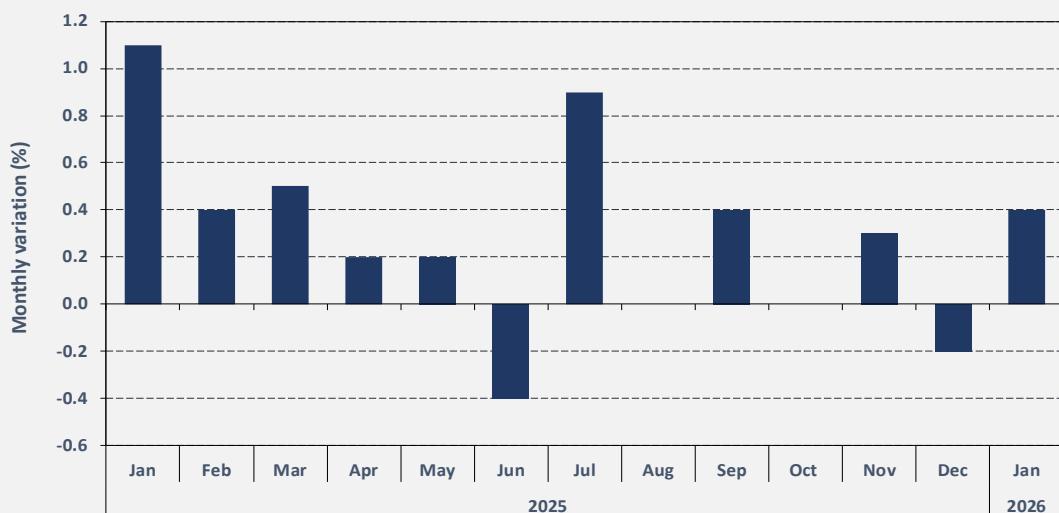
Note: This document is a translation of the official Spanish version of the CPI bulletin.

- In January, the monthly variation of the CPI was **0.4%**.
- The most notable increases were in alcoholic beverages and tobacco and in health, while the most notable decrease was in transport.

In January 2026, the monthly variation of the CPI was 0.4%, the cumulative variation was 0.4%, and the twelve-month variation was 2.8%.

Development of the CPI

Monthly variations (January 2025 – January 2026)



In January, ten of the thirteen divisions of the CPI basket had positive impacts on its monthly variation and three divisions had negative impacts. Among the divisions that increased in prices, the most notable were alcoholic beverages and tobacco (3.1%), which had an impact of 0.109 percentage points (pp), and health (1.2%), which had an impact of 0.102 pp. The remaining divisions with positive influence on the CPI had a combined impact of 0.381 pp. Among the divisions with monthly decreases in prices, the most notable was transport (-1.3%), which had an impact of -0.164 pp.

Divisions

Division 2: Alcoholic beverages and tobacco



Monthly increases were observed in four of the five classes of alcoholic beverages and tobacco. The most important increases were in wine (7.2%), which had an impact of 0.060 pp, and beer (2.4%), which had an impact of 0.027 pp. Of the six products of the division, five increased in price, notably wine (7.2%), which had an impact of 0.060 pp, and beer (2.4%), which had an impact of 0.027 pp. The remaining products of the division with positive influence had a combined impact of 0.022 pp.

Division 6: Health



Compared to the previous month, the division of health increased in prices in six of its seven classes. The most important increases were in dental services (2.0%), which had an impact of 0.032 pp, and medicines (1.2%), which had an impact of 0.030 pp. Of the twenty-three products of the division, seventeen increased in prices, notably dental services (2.0%), which had an impact of 0.032 pp, and medical appointments (1.5%), which had an impact of 0.017 pp. The remaining products of this division with positive influence on the CPI had a combined impact of 0.057 pp.

Division 7: Transport



The prices in the division of transport decreased in four of its eleven classes. The most important decreases were in fuels for personal vehicles (-3.3%), which had an impact of -0.112 pp, and passenger transport by air (-11.8%), which had an impact of -0.101 pp. Of the twenty-five products of the division, eight decreased in prices, notably gasoline (-3.3%), which had an impact of -0.099 pp, and international air transport (-17.6%), which had an impact of -0.095 pp. The remaining products with negative influence on the CPI had a combined impact of -0.050 pp.

Products

Co-proprietor expenses

In January, the monthly variation of this product was 4.5%, which had an impact of 0.065 pp on the overall CPI, and its cumulative variation was 4.5%.

Wine

The monthly variation in the price of wine was 7.2%, which had an impact of 0.060 pp, and the cumulative variation was 7.2%.

Computers

Compared to the previous month, the price of computers increased 8.0%, which had an impact of 0.046 pp, and the cumulative variation was 8.0%.

Soft drinks

The monthly variation in the price of soft drinks was 3.8%, which had an impact of 0.037 pp, and the cumulative variation was 3.8%.

Gasoline

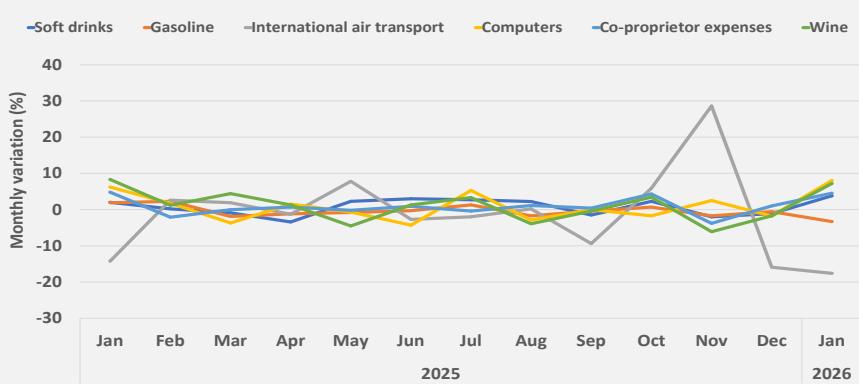
The price of gasoline decreased 3.3% compared to the previous month, which had an impact of -0.099 pp, and the cumulative variation was -3.3%.

International air transport

The monthly variation in the price of this product was -17.6%, which had an impact of -0.095 pp, and its cumulative variation was -17.6%.

Development of product prices

Monthly variations (January 2025 – January 2026)
